Building improvements

As promised, I wanted to share with you some photos of the building work that took place over the Summer holidays.

Extensive work was done to create a new purpose built early years unit in the lower building, windows have been replaced in the main building, and new and attractive toilets have been fitted in both the early years and Progression step 2 areas.

The playground has had new drainage, been resurfaced and railings have been fitted to enclose the nursery and reception area.

Classrooms have been decorated and new carpets fitted. It really is a transformation, and we are very grateful to the Local Authority for working hard to complete the work in time for the children's return to school.
