

Dear Parents/Guardians/Carers

At the end of my first term in Coed-y-Lan I wish to thank everyone for the warm welcome and support I have received since September. I am delighted to have been appointed the substantive Headteacher, and look forward to working with you all in the years ahead, to make sure that the pupils in Coed-y-Lan receive the exciting and aspirational education they deserve.

I was very pleased to welcome Mr Rees and Mrs Boulton back this half term. In order to provide continuity for the class, we were able to retain Miss Williams in Dosbarth Castan, and I am pleased to confirm that this will continue for the Spring term. This will not only allow Miss Williams to continue the great work she has been doing in Dosbarth Castan, we hope it will allow Mr Rees and Mrs Boulton to support me in continuing to make progress against the recommendations in our Post Inspection Action Plan.

This half-term, the whole school topic has been based on 'Communities, Cultures and Celebrations.' It has been a cross curricular theme looking at how communities celebrate. At the beginning of November the children learned about Divali, and over the last two months, they have studied a range of festivals, culminating in Christmas, perfect timing!

Over the past few weeks, we have continued to focus on learning, whilst also enjoying Christmas activities. On the first of December we took pupils in Years 1-6 to watch two of our own very talented pupils, Phoebe and Erin, performing in 'Cinderella' in the Coliseum, Aberdare. The children and staff were extremely proud of them both.

Last week I was also very proud of all the children when we did our own Christmas performances. Dosbarth Celyn were excellent in the 'Wriggly Nativity.' It was a pleasure to see our very youngest pupils all participating with such enthusiasm.

The rest of the school were also outstanding in our first 'Coed-y-Lan Carols' in St Catherine's Church. The children's voices filled every corner of the church hall, and our Values Christmas tree was a sight to behold. I'd like to thank Charlotte and Trish from St Catherine's for their support and assistance in making the concerts such a success.

Thank you to everyone who purchased the children's Christmas crafts. Following an assembly with Councillor Brencher, the children decided to raise money for PONT, so that we could buy Christmas gifts for our partner schools in Uganda. The children raised £150 in total.

I want to say a huge thankyou to our dedicated PTA who organised a café and tuck shop at every concert, raising over £900 for the school. The hard work and organisation that is involved in each event is tremendous, and I cant thank you all enough. I know the PTA team are always looking for new recruits, so please get in touch if you would like to help them raise important funds for the school.

At the end of this very busy term, I must say a huge thankyou to the team here at Coed-y-Lan. It has been a very busy and challenging term, with lots of change, but everyone has worked together for the benefit of the children. I am looking forward to working with you all in the years ahead. As you are aware, Coed-y-Lan was placed in special measures following our core inspection in February of this year. We were re-visited by Estyn on November 21st -23rd and I wish to update you on our progress against our Post Inspection Action Plan.

During this visit, Estyn focussed on three of the recommendations;

- Recommendation 1 Improve leadership at all levels;
- Recommendation 2 Improve teaching and assessment across the school;
- Recommendation 5 Address the safeguarding issue that was identified during the inspection.

I am pleased to share with you that the inspectors recognised that the whole school community is working together to create a positive culture of improvement based on a shared vision that we all aspire to achieve.

Over the last term we have introduced effective systems and processes that are supporting the school to run more effectively. The monitoring and evaluation systems that have been introduced are beginning to have a positive impact on teaching and learning, as do the extensive improvements to the indoor and outdoor learning environments.

As Headteacher, I have ensured all staff have accessed professional learning opportunities which are bringing about improvement to teaching and learning. Staff have also benefitted from opportunities to observe effective practice in other schools, and this is something that we plan to continue in the new year.

The Governing Body has worked proactively to provide useful support and challenge to the school, and all Governors work diligently in their roles to fully understand our improvement progress.

During the re-inspection, inspectors commented on the respectful relationships between pupils and staff, the calm yet busy learning environments and the pupils' enthusiasm for learning. We have worked on developing pupils' independent learning skills this term, and this is an area for further development. The shared learning areas that have been created are beginning to be used well and will also be further developed in the new year.

We are currently working on refining assessment approaches in line with the new curriculum. This is an area for development in many schools, and we will be working with improvement partners and Central South Consortium to ensure our assessment processes are robust and support pupils in understanding the next steps in their learning.

The safeguarding recommendation identified in the core inspection has been fully addressed and the inspectors have closed this recommendation.

Although we have made good progress and are moving in the right direction, we are at the beginning of our improvement journey, and the changes we have made over the last term need time to embed to have a positive impact on pupil outcomes. Currently we remain in special measures and will be revisited again in a further 4-6 months. I would like to thank everyone for their support over the last term.
