Dear parents/ carers,

I cant believe a whole academic year has passed since I joined the team at Coed-Y-Lan, and what a year it has been. I am very grateful for all the support we have received from our families and community that has enabled us to make very good progress in moving the school forward this year.

Although the school still currently remains in the Estyn 'Special Measures' category we are very pleased to be able to share with you that in our latest progress meeting, the Local Authority has recognised the rapid progress that has been made in school improvement this year. This is a testament to very hard work of all the staff at the school and the support we have received from the Governors, LA and CSC.

The children have wowed us all this year with their zest for learning. They have approached each of our varied topics with enthusiasm and excitement, and the progress in their learning has been a pleasure to see. Every half term we have sent a video showcasing the range of skills, knowledge and experiences that the children have received in their classes and we hope that you feel well informed and involved in your child's learning.

As well as all the classroom based activities, we have also engaged with as many additional enrichment activities as we could to provide a wide range of opportunities to meet the needs of our children and to provide a broad and balanced curriculum. These have included expressive arts activities such as drumming and ukulele lessons, a magic of the harp workshop, film making and animation sessions and dance workshops.

We have taken part in rugby, football and basketball tournaments, and hope to increase opportunities to participate in sporting events next year. We have worked with the University of South Wales and Technocamps to provide additional opportunities in Science and Technology and we have worked with David Harris from Grow Rhondda, Harry Little from USW to develop our garden.

In response to parent surveys at the beginning of the year, we have tried to improve communication. We introduced Parenthub as the primary platform for all whole school communications. We have also tried to increase opportunities for parents to come into school to work with the children, and this is something we intend to continue developing next year.

It is the same survey that Estyn sends prior to inspections and that we sent earlier this year. We repeat the same survey so that we can measure how well we have addressed concerns raised in previous surveys, and to gauge parental satisfaction.

I would like to thank the PTA who have worked extremely hard this year to plan successful events which have raised very important funds for the school. We greatly appreciate all their efforts, as the money they raise helps us provide the additional enrichment activities such as developing the garden, funding the bus to the Hay festival and of course the wonderful prom, to name but a few.

At the end of term, we are sad to say goodbye to Miss Greenman and Mrs Rees. Mrs Rees joined CYL last April, and has worked tirelessly as the teaching assistant in Dosbarth Helyg supporting the children to achieve their full potential.

Miss Greenman joined CYL in September and and has led in Dosbarth Celyn, ensuring our youngest children have had the very best start. They are both moving on to new schools in September, and we wish them both the very best of luck, you will both be missed.

In September we welcome our new seconded DHT Mrs Judith Davies. Mrs Davies has worked with us this year in her capacity as a the regional consortium literacy adviser, and we are all delighted that she will be joining our team next term.

At the end of my first year in Coed-Y-Lan I would like to thank all the children, parents, staff and Governors for working together and supporting the school. It has been a very rewarding year, and I look forward to next year.






Today is the last day for our Year 6 leavers. They are an amazingly talented, kind and polite group of children who will be missed by us all here in Coed-Y-Lan.

Uniform consultation

As you will be aware, a few years ago the school logo was updated, but the school uniform has never been changed. The Governing Body has agreed that we can consult with the children and parents to gather views on whether we should update the uniform.

Should the consultation result in agreement to changing the uniform, this would be done over time, commencing in September 2025 and being phased in gradually. There will be no requirement to purchase new uniform before you would need to, and there will be no requirement to purchase uniform which displays the logo, this is optional (in line with WG guidance on school uniforms) The options we would like you to consider are,

Option 1

Maintain the existing uniform.

Option 2

Maintaining the same colours but with the new logo. Grey trousers/skirt/ shorts pink/red checked summer dresses (Logo would not have white background)

Option 3

Changing the colour of the sweathshirt and polo shirt to royal blue to match the colours in the logo. Grey trousers/skirt/ shorts blue/ green checked summer dresses (Logo would not have white background)

ALL children who are recorded as having asthma will need to have an asthma pump in school at all times. The pumps will be centrally located and should not be kept in their school bags as we will need to record when asthma pumps have been administered.


Medication will not be able to be administered unless it is labelled with the children's name and the administration of medicines form has been filled.
