

Community Connections

This half term we have continued to take every opportunity to engage with our local community. To mark VE Day, we visited the YMa to watch original newsreels from the day itself, this was a powerful way to connect with history.

Our children contributed beautifulartworkto the local library and the Principality Building Society, and Dosbarth Bedwtook part in a special intergenerational craft session as part of the 'Turning Ponty Blue' initiative, raising awareness of dementia and building connections across generations.

We were very excited to welcome Mick Antoniw to Coed-Y-Lan. He came to talk to our school senedd about his role as member of the Welsh Parliament for the Pontypridd constituency and the type of work this involves. He was very interested in the learning we've been doing and was particularly impressed by Dosbarth Celyn's litter and dog poo protest in Ponty town centre as this is high on his agenda too. We took him up to the garden where we sang Welsh songs and talked more about his and our experiences, and about how our school has changed and grown in the last couple of years. Uniform Consultation

In Summer 2024, we invited parents to take part in a consultation about the possibility of updating our school uniform to reflect our current school logo, which was adopted in 2022. The survey was repeated in Autumn 2024, we received a total of 21 responses, with an even split between those in favour of keeping the current uniform and those supporting a change.

To ensure pupils' views were also heard, we conducted a survey with the children, and a working party from the Governing Body gathered their opinions.

The results showed that 66% of pupils would like to change the uniform to a blue polo shirt and sweatshirt featuring the new school logo.

Based on this feedback, the plan is to begin rolling out the new uniform in September 2026. There will be a transition period during which both the current and new uniforms will be acceptable, allowing families time to adjust gradually. We'll continue to keep you updated as plans progress and will share more details closer to the rollout.



Raising Awareness and Showing Support

This half term, our school community came together to raise awareness and show support for important causes.

We proudly wore purple to honour and support service children. As part of the day, we read the beautiful and moving Dandelion Poem, which helped us reflect on the unique experiences of children in military families. We were thrilled to be featured on the <u>Supporting Service Children in Education website</u>, recognising our commitment to inclusion and understanding.

This week we also wore green to raise awareness of Coeliac Disease. A heartfelt thank you goes to Mrs Pugh, who kindly visited every class to talk about the condition and its impact.
